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26           (1) As used in this section, the term:  
 27           (a) "Individualized seizure action plan," or "ISAP," means  
 28 a document that outlines a set of procedural guidelines and  
 29 specific directions for the provision of health care and  
 30 emergency services by a school for a student who has epilepsy or  
 31 seizure disorders.  
 32           (b) "Medical professional" means a physician licensed  
 33 under chapter 458 or 459, a physician assistant licensed under  
 34 chapter 458 or chapter 459, or an advanced practiced registered  
 35 nurse licensed under s. 464.012 who provides epilepsy or seizure  
 36 disorder care to the student.  
 37           (c) "School" has the same meaning as in s. 1003.01(2).  
 38           (2)(a) A school must provide epilepsy or seizure disorder  
 39 care to a student based upon the student's ISAP, individualized  
 40 education plan, or s. 504 accommodation plan, as applicable. To  
 41 initiate implementation of an ISAP, a student's parent must  
 42 submit an ISAP meeting the requirements of paragraph (b) to the  
 43 school principal and school nurse or other appropriate school  
 44 employee. The ISAP should be submitted before or at the  
 45 beginning of the school year, upon enrollment, or as soon as  
 46 practicable following a diagnosis of a seizure disorder for a  
 47 student. The provisions of a student's ISAP remain in effect  
 48 until the student's parent submits a revised ISAP, signed by a  
 49 medical professional, identifying any changes based on the  
 50 student's condition. Implementation of an ISAP does not absolve

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51 or limit the school of its obligation to provide a student  
 52 special instruction, services, or accommodations pursuant to  
 53 part V of chapter 1003, the Individuals with Disabilities  
 54 Education Act, and s. 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. A  
 55 school may implement training and student supports outlined in  
 56 this section regardless of whether a parent submits an ISAP.

57 (b) An ISAP must be developed and signed by a medical  
 58 professional, in consultation with the student's parent, and  
 59 include the following:

60 1. Written orders from the student's medical professional  
 61 outlining the student's epilepsy or seizure disorder recommended  
 62 care.

63 2. The parent's signature.

64 3. The student's epilepsy or seizure disorder symptoms.

65 4. Any accommodations the student requires for school  
 66 trips, after-school programs and activities, class parties, and  
 67 any other school-related activities.

68 5. When and whom to call for medical assistance.

69 6. The student's ability to manage, and the student's  
 70 level of understanding of, his or her epilepsy or seizure  
 71 disorder.

72 7. How to maintain communication with the student, the  
 73 student's parent, and the student's health care team, school  
 74 nurse, and educational staff.

75 8. Any rescue medication prescribed by the student's

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76 | medical professional and how and when to administer the  
 77 | medication.

78 | (3) The school nurse or an appropriate school employee of  
 79 | a school that receives an ISAP pursuant to subsection (2) shall:

80 | (a) In accordance with s. 1006.062, coordinate the  
 81 | provision of epilepsy and seizure disorder care at the school  
 82 | for the student, including administering anti-seizure and rescue  
 83 | medications as outlined in the ISAP.

84 | (b) Verify that each school employee whose duties include  
 85 | regular contact with the student has completed training in the  
 86 | care of students with epilepsy and seizure disorders. The  
 87 | training must include how to recognize the symptoms of and  
 88 | provide care for epilepsy and seizure disorders. To assist  
 89 | schools in meeting this requirement, the Department of Education  
 90 | shall identify on its website one or more online training  
 91 | courses that are provided by a nonprofit national organization  
 92 | that supports the welfare of individuals with epilepsy and  
 93 | seizure disorders and are available free of charge to schools.

94 | (4) The school shall provide each school employee whose  
 95 | duties include regular contact with the student with all of the  
 96 | following:

97 | (a) Notice of the student's condition.

98 | (b) Information from the ISAP on how to provide the  
 99 | recommended care for the student if he or she shows symptoms of  
 100 | the epilepsy or seizure disorder.

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101            (c) The contact information for the student's parent and  
102 emergency contacts.

103            Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
